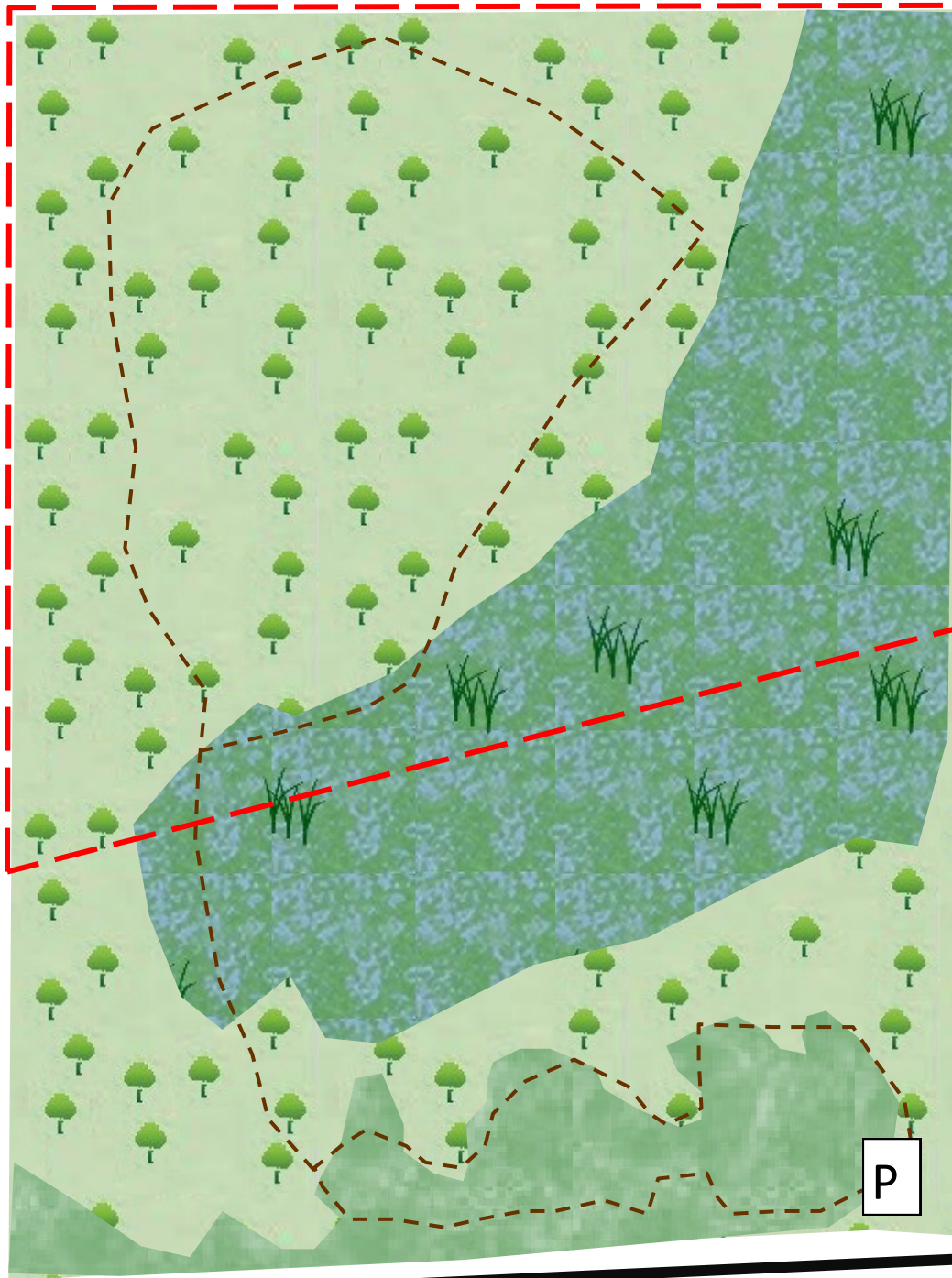


Wolf Oak Woods 30 Acres

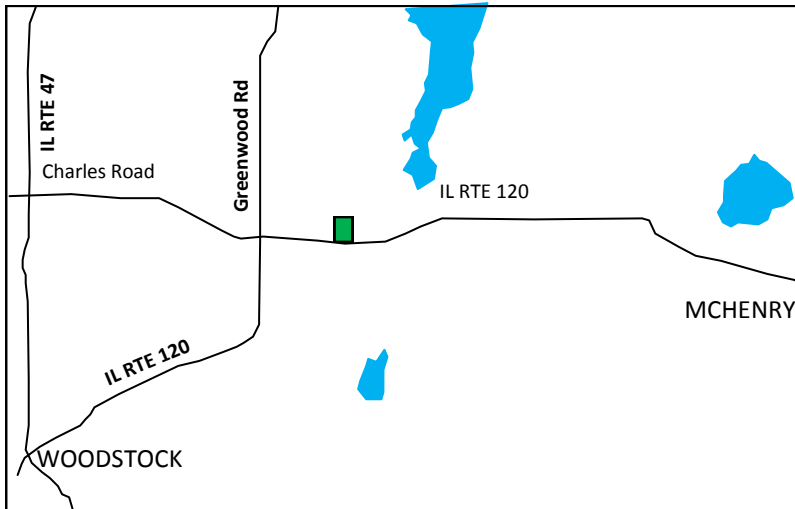

INFO AND HISTORY ABOUT SITE

The Wolf Oak Woods is named after the Wolf Oak Tree- an important ecological relic that embodies the structure and form of vast oak savannas from before the time of settlement. Most of these trees are gone- either cut down by humans or shade pruned from lack of fire and an unbound amount of woody growth in our region. The tree, clearly visible from a major highway, has become a cultural icon throughout the county and serves as an ambassador to teach the general public about the history of the region and the ecological problems of today.

The Preserve also protects over 8 acres of wetland, and over 18 acres of savanna and oak woodland. The woodland has an amazing array of remnant, native wildflowers such as Shooting Star and Dutchmans Breeches.

We are in the process of creating a permanent trail system, so be patient if hiking if the north area as it may be rustic and not well marked.
